The Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioner's Board met on Thursday, April 17, 2025, in the

1st Floor Conference Room of the Schoolcraft County Building, City of Manistique, Michigan.

Chairman Paul Walker called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. The roll was called with the

Chairman Paul Walker led the Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioners and the members of

the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to

approve the April 10, 2024, Board and Audit-Finance Meeting Minutes. The motion carried by a

unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Troy Bassett to

approve the agenda as printed. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members

present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to turn

the meeting over to Commissioner Troy Bassett for the meeting of the whole - Medical Examiner

Contract. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

Tim Noble addressed recent issues that affect our contract with Medical Institute of Forensic

Science & Medicine, one payment left on contract of \$2,500, and cause in his opinion to cancel

the contract to medical examiner services. Tim Noble suggests a letter terminating the contract for their breach of contract and in the same letter give notice to terminate the contract for no cause in the event we were sued and the Court found that they were not in breach of contract.

Beth Edwards clarified the Board of Commissioners appoint the Medical Examiner and if truly Dr. Kahn resigned on April 15, 2025, we are currently without a medical examiner. There has been no communication from MIFSM regarding this issue. In addition to the phone call with Brian Bosley, Dickinson County Administrator, this morning which including Tim Noble, she also had contacted Mid-Michigan Medical Examiner Group, and they would be willing to help if Dickinson County could not until there is a formal plan.

Sheriff Charles Willour talked with Dr. Martin J. Cristanelli, MD (Dickinson County) and he is willing to take Schoolcraft County Medical Examiner on for six months as well as provide autopsies if needed. Dr. Cristanelli advised that possibly working with Alger County to get a joint Medical Examiner.

Beth Edwards stated that Brian Bosley, Dickinson County Administrator, is on Zoom and he has stated that they are willing to take Schoolcraft County on for 6 months.

Tim Noble advised that his advice would be to immediately start working with Dickinson County to work out the details.

Troy Bassett addressed Brian Bosley regarding fees.

Discussion regarding past practices.

Cory Barr asked about payment for the past Medical Examiner.

Tim Russell agreed with everything that had been said. Also addressed the transport from scene to Sheriff's Department and serving the public.

Sheriff Willour addressed original verbal agreement that individuals would not wait for autopsies/transport longer than 24 to 48 hours. That has not happened.

There was discussion regarding procedures, situations, and how the situation dictates procedure.

It was moved by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to adjourn the meeting of the whole. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to resume the Special Board meeting. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Craig Reiter and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to authorize Timothy Noble to author and send a letter to MIFSM to terminate the Medical Examiner Contract for cause, effective immediately, and also notice for no cause (180-day notice) in case no cause is found. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to appoint Martin J. Cristanelli, MD, Schoolcraft County Medical Examiner, effective immediately for a term of six (6) months. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to start working on a contract with Dickinson County. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to establish a Medical Examiner Task Force to include City of Manistique, Sheriff, Prosecutor, Personnel Committee Chairman, and Schoolcraft Memorial Hospital. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Craig Reiter to hire Ed Unger as Medical Examiner Investigator for \$150 and mileage per investigation effective immediately. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

Transportation from scene to Sheriff's Department and to Autopsy was discussed and will be moved to the next Audit/Finance Committee Meeting.

**Public Comment:** Dixie Anderson addressed medical examiner issues and communication.

Sheriff Willour thought the taskforce would help with communication.

Tim Noble addressed problems with the company verses contract violation issues.

Commissioner's Comment: Craig Reiter addressed the medical examiner and feel the County has moved in a good direction.

Troy Bassett addressed the medical examiner and moving forward.

It was moved by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to adjourn. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE 608 (L-4024) ASSESSED AND EQUALIZED VALUATIONS WORKSHEET

This form is due on or before the first Monday in May to the State Tax Commission (STC) (MCL 209.5 (2)) by attaching a signed L-4024 into the Michigan Equalization Gateway (MEG) filing cabinet and submitting the L-4024 form in the MEG county portal by following the instructions below.

L-4023 form by PSD staff. All data on the L-4024 is populated from the previously submitted L-4023, except for the number of acres. Counties must manually enter the assessable acreage by Property Services Divisions (PSD) staff. MEG will auto-generate the L-4024 form upon the successful save and submission of the L-4023 form by the county and the acceptance of the The MEG system will autogenerate the L-4023 following the successful save and submission of all local uni L-4018 and L-4022AV forms by the county and the acceptance of those forms for each local unit.

The county must review, in the MEG county portal the L-4024 valuation data for each local unit as well as the county totals. The county shall verify the valuation and acreage data in the MEG county portal then save the L-4024 in the L-4024 form module thereby creating an L-4024 PDF rendering. The county shall print this PDF rendering and present it to your County Board of Commissioners for signing during their equalization session. MCL 209.5 requires the Equalization Director and the Chairperson and Clerk of the County Board of Commissioners to sign the L-4024. After signing, scan and upload the signed form to the filing cabinet in the MEG, submit the L-4024 in the MEG county portal. After the paper copy of the L-4024 has been signed, scanned and uploaded to the filing cabinet in MEG, submit the L-4024 in the MEG county portal. Once submitted, the L-4024 report will be locked in MEG. To make subsequent changes please contact the Property Services Division at equalization@michigan.gov.
