## SCHOOLCRAFT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS BOARD MEETING and AUDIT/FINANCE MEETING

The Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioner's Board Meeting / Audit Finance Meeting met on Thursday, December 11, 2025, in the District Courtroom of the Schoolcraft County Building, City of Manistique, Michigan. Chairman Paul Walker called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. The roll was called with the following members present and/or absent:

Chairman Paul Walker led the Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioners and the members of the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Troy Bassett to approve the minutes of November 25, 2025, Board and Audit Meeting of the Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioners and November 25, 2025, Closed Session. The motion carried by unanimous aye vote of the Board members present. [Copies of minutes are available at the Office of the Schoolcraft County Clerk.]

Chairman Paul Walker asked if there were any additions, deletions, or corrections to the printed agenda. Commissioner Paul Walker asked to add Personnel Committee Action items and Ratify FOPLC & AFSCME Union Contracts. **It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Daniel P. Hoholik to approve the amended agenda. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**Brief Public Comment:** Dennis Green opposes proposed cellphone tower location in Thompson. Jennifer Green opposes proposed cellphone tower location in Thompson.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to attach the document given by Jennifer Green to the minutes. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**New Business:**

Commissioner Paul Walker gave an update for the Indian/Gulliver/McDonald Lake Authorities.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to appoint Victoria George to the Schoolcraft County Land Bank Authority. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Daniel P. Hoholik to appoint Gary Demers and John Ziemba to the Schoolcraft County Planning Commission, terms expiring December 31, 2028. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Daniel P. Hoholik and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to Opt-out of PA 152. Roll vote: Daniel P. Hoholik, yes; Bruce Birr, yes; Troy Bassett, no; Paul Walker, yes. The motion carried by a majority aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Commissioner Troy Bassett to set the date for the Schoolcraft County Board of Commissioners Organizational Meeting for January 5, 2026, at 12 noon. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Paul Walker and was seconded by Commissioner Daniel P. Hoholik to make December 26 a courtesy day off for County Courthouse employees when it falls on a Friday and add it to the Schoolcraft County Policy and Procedure effective immediately. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to approve the City of Manistique to place a 75' tower/pole at the Denton Nelson 5<sup>th</sup> Street Ball Field at a minimum of 100' from the dugout, the City of Manistique will need to provide proof of liability

insurance showing the County as also insured and shall pay 50% of the electric bill. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to retire the green Chevrolet pickup truck as it is unsafe to drive and authorize the junk yard to pick it up. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It is moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Daniel P. Hoholik to approve the AFSCME Contract and the FOPLC Letter of Understanding as presented and authorize Paul Walker, Board Chair, to sign both. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to approve the medical insurance policy as follows: BC/BS of Michigan \$7,000/\$14,000 deductible, AmFirst Wrap to \$250/\$500 deductible and add to HRA Reimbursement - \$25 copay Non-Preferred Prescriptions (\$125 to \$100) and \$100 copay ER Visit (\$250 to \$100), all other HRA Reimbursement will stay the same, vision and dental policy will remain the same. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Troy Bassett to authorize Paul Walker, Board Chair, to decline or give permission to seek legal opinion on issues that arise in the Zoning Department. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Paul Walker to waive the \$600 fee for Variance/Special Use Appeal Request to the Zoning Board of Appeals for G. Price. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Paul Walker and was seconded by Troy Bassett to have Beth Edwards draft contract/memorandum of understanding language to implement sick-time policy for jail part-time employees effective January 1 (or when signed by all parties), accrue 1 hour for every 30 hours worked, maximum carryover is 72 hours, and no cash value at separation from employment. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Troy Bassett and was seconded by Commissioner Paul Walker to approve the quote from SineTech in the amount of \$19,061.38 for new cameras in the jail, apply for the MMRMA grant for 50% reimbursement and pay for the system from the 101-000-005.672

restricted funds-sale of phone cards. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Paul Walker and was seconded by Commissioner Bruce Birr to approve the Airport MDOT Contract 2026-0142 for Beacon Design Grant in the amount of \$45,000 and County Share in the amount of \$2,250 and authorize Paul Walker, Board Chairman, to sign the grant and Sponsor Certification. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.

**It was moved** by Commissioner Bruce Birr and was seconded by Paul Walker to approve the FY26 Survey and Remonumentation Grant in the amount of \$77,148, contracting with Mike Peterson for 74 corners, and authorize Heather LaLonde to sign the same. The motion carried by a unanimous aye vote of the Board members present.



Tower Notices- Only given to people 300 feet away from Martin's property that are on the M149 side. So...as far as we can tell only 3 people even received notices. Dennis called Randy E. at the Fish Hatchery yesterday he knew nothing about it.

#1- November 18 at 3:30. This was a permit for tower AFTER county already approved height variance which we were NOT notified about.

-This notice was at first cancelled as the company did not have proper placement away from the road (300 when it should be 500) company name :The Towers LLC

#2-November 18 meeting CANCELLED until further notice.

Then, received email from County Administrator stating that meeting may be on December 4, then heard nothing else about it.

#3- December 19 at 3:30 now new company named Ramaker is listed with no explanation.

#4- December 19 at 8:00 pm. Still not correct. I had to call the Administrator and he stated it was a typo, the meeting is ACTUALLY 8:00 am.

Also, this notice stated last day to comment is November 19 even though the notice was not dated until November 25. Again called, stated it was a typo. Should be December 19.

Companies who are affiliated with these companies: Ramaker, The Towers LLC, American Towers LLC (a global company) Vertical Bridges LLC, Tillman and Associates LLC.

When company came to our house by mistake, they had no identifiers on vehicle or clothing.

## Cell Tower Health Highlights

Study (2004) - Individuals residing closer than 350 meters from the tower experienced a higher cancer rate. 129 cases per 10,000 compared to 16 per 10,000 over the course of a year.

A study of 1,000 residents living closer than 400 meters over 10 years showed the cancer rate was 3 times higher than other residents.

**Recommended safe distances:**

0-100 meters- avoid living or working here

100-400 meters- moderate health risks

400-1,000 meters- low risk

“Microwave Syndrome” is caused by 5G towers- symptoms include: headache, dizziness, balance disorder, skin problems, higher rates of lymphoma, sleep problems.

There are many instances of Microwave Syndrome and this is well documented across the country.

When towers were first put in, people thought the waves “bounce” off the skin. However, because it is a form of electrical energy, sweat ducts and skin which is the largest organ in your body, readily absorb these waves. This is particularly true with women and kids because they have thinner skin.

Insurance companies compare the risk of 5G towers to the same as asbestos.

The International Association of Firefighters passes a resolution in 2004 opposing cell towers after finding that the antennas on their fire stations caused a large amount of neurological damage.

Many cell towers throughout the US have caught fire and collapsed, posing a significant health and safety concern.

In the journal, *Experimental Oncology* “A year of operation of a powerful base transmitting station for mobile communication resulted in a dramatic increase of cancer incidence, particularly breast and brain cancer”.

Research in 2023 found that in distances lower than 400 meters cell towers result in male fertility problems, low sperm count and high blood pressure.



"Negative public perception of, and regulations regarding, the perceived health risks relating to 5G networks could undermine market acceptance of our 5G services" (page 13)

"We, along with equipment manufacturers and other carriers, are subject to current and potential future lawsuits **alleging adverse health effects arising from the use of wireless handsets or from wireless transmission equipment such as cell towers.**"

"In addition, **the FCC has from time to time gathered data regarding wireless device emissions, and its assessment of the risks associated with using wireless devices may evolve based on its findings.** Any of these allegations or changes in risk assessments could result in customers purchasing fewer devices and wireless services, could result in significant legal and regulatory liability, and could have a material adverse effect on our business, reputation, financial condition, cash flows and operating results." (T-Mobile 10-K Report page 21)



A 2000 Ecologic Institute Report commissioned by T-Mobile and Deutsche Telekom. The report recommended an RF exposure limit 1000x lower than the FCC's current power density limit after reviewing the research on biological effects, including impacts to the immune system, central nervous system, hormones, cancer, neurotransmitters and fertility.


# Verizon Total Mobile Protection Plan Defines Non-ionizing Radiation as "Pollution"

## 16. Pollution

The discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration or escape of pollutants. Pollutants means any solid, liquid, gaseous, or thermal irritant or contaminant including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, acid, alkalis, chemicals, artificially produced electric fields, magnetic field, electromagnetic field, sound waves, microwaves, and all artificially produced ionizing or non-ionizing radiation and/or waste. Waste includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reclaimed.

AT&T, Sprint and T-Mobile also have similar "pollution" definitions and they refuse to cover damages.
